Interpretation of the Woods Services Award

Luther W. Lord

May 19, 1918–March 5, 1976

Founded in 1913, the Woods Services and Residential Treatment Center is a coeducational, residential, and day school for the exceptional child and adult. It serves individuals who are learning and developmentally disabled, neurologically impaired, emotionally disturbed, and those who have multiple disabilities.

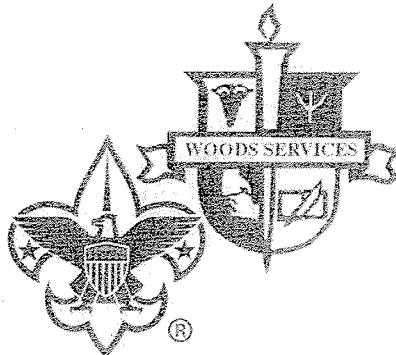
Woods Services is located in Langhorne, Pennsylvania, and has an enrollment of more than 450 students ranging from preschool-age through adulthood.

Luther Wellington Lord served Woods Services as a residential supervisor for more than 23 years and was the founder and coordinator of the Scouting program at Woods Services. He was an active member of the National Advisory Committee on Scouting for the Handicapped and served as the course director for national workshops at Philmont Scout Ranch, Schiff Scout Reservation, and numerous area and local courses. He was author of many Scouting resources being used as guidelines throughout the United States. Mr. Lord was an active board member of the Bucks County Council of the Boy Scouts of America and a member of its Exploring committee.

First presented in 1978, the Woods Services Award is in memory of Luther W. Lord for exceptional service and leadership in the field of Scouts with disabilities.

Instructions and Additional Information

1. This nomination form should be sent to the Woods Services Award Committee, S250, national office, Boy Scouts of America, by December 31, 2005.
2. A nominee shall
 - a. Be currently registered as a member of the Boy Scouts of America and have three or more years of service in any Scouting capacity related to Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and/or Venturers with disabilities.
 - b. Have done all Scouting activities related to Scouts with disabilities on a strictly volunteer basis.
3. One national award is granted each year.
4. The award will be available for presentation by May 1, 2006. It is to be presented at a suitable national or regional meeting, with consideration given to the availability of the recipient.
5. The award, a handsome, engraved plaque, is provided each year by Woods Services in Langhorne, Pennsylvania.
